

Exploring and building on our programs

The 2022-2023 financial year was another busy one for The Humour Foundation, bringing laughter where it was unexpected, yet most needed. This year, with your generous support, we continued to make a difference, impacting over 251,000 children, aged care residents, carers and staff in 21 hospitals, one hospice and 21 residential aged care facilities around Australia. We also welcomed eight new Clown Doctors and Laughter Care Specialists to our community during the year.

With your support, it's also been a year for us to continue exploring and building on our programs, bringing laughter, joy and connection to children's hospitals and aged care facilities in new and different ways.

Western Australia

The Humour Foundation's Clown Doctors and Laughter Care programs promote the therapeutic power of laughter, creativity and human connection in healthcare settings. This year we launched an exciting and innovative pilot program with Perth Children's Hospital in its Plastics and Fractures Outpatient Clinic, marking a significant milestone in patient care. Building on our extensive expertise in outpatient clinics in other cities, Clown Doctors have now been embedded into the clinic to improve patient experience and foster a positive environment for children and families attending the specialty clinic, as well as hospital staff. It sets the stage for potential expansion to other outpatient clinics and clinical areas, reflecting the commitment to integrating Clown Doctors as valued members of therapeutic teams.

South Australia

During the year, we extended our reach in South Australia, customising our Laughter Care program normally delivered in residential aged care facilities, to support patients over 65 years in a hospital environment at Flinders Medical Centre. This built on our existing Clown Doctors program we have been delivering at the centre since 2006 and allowed performers to work with both younger and older patients, often in the same day. There has been a lot of enthusiasm for the program from families, hospital staff and management and we are now exploring sustainable funding options.

Queensland and New South Wales

As well as piloting customised Laughter Care programs in different environments, we delivered our first Laughter Care program in Queensland at two sites. The program also continues to grow and go from strength to strength in New South Wales, bringing together medicine and the arts and improving the quality of life of aged care residents in a unique, person-centric way.

Building on our expertise

To work in sensitive hospital environments and create genuine human connection, our performers undergo continuous professional development.

In honour of The Humour Foundation's late co-founder, this year saw the inaugural Dr Peter Spitzer Scholarship awarded. Peter was a great believer in research, training and collaboration and the scholarship in his name will provide financial support for a member of The Humour Foundation community to investigate a topic, issue, program or training that would benefit our healthcare clowning work. This year we congratulated Emilie Bloom (aka Dr Fizzy Whizzy) as our first scholarship recipient, spending time with Israel's Dream Doctors and being mentored by her host Shoshi Ofir (aka Dr Hearta) proving what a gift healthcare clowning is to the world.

Using professional performers, rather than volunteers, is what makes The Humour Foundation so unique. In fact, a hopeful Clowntern (apprentice Clown Doctor) must successfully complete 50 hospital rounds under the mentorship of senior Clown Doctors before they graduate to their red nose.



A Social Return on Investment study (SROI) completed in FY15 found that when the Clown Doctors program is delivered in **hospitals**, an investment of \$1 returns an increased social return of \$4.20 to the community.

\$4.20 Your impact A new study completed in FY22 also by Social Ventures Australia found that when the Clown Doctors program is delivered in specialist **clinical spaces**, an investment of \$1 returns an increased social return of \$9.90 to the community.





Using the 2015 Social Return on Investment calculation, the Clown Doctors program delivered over
